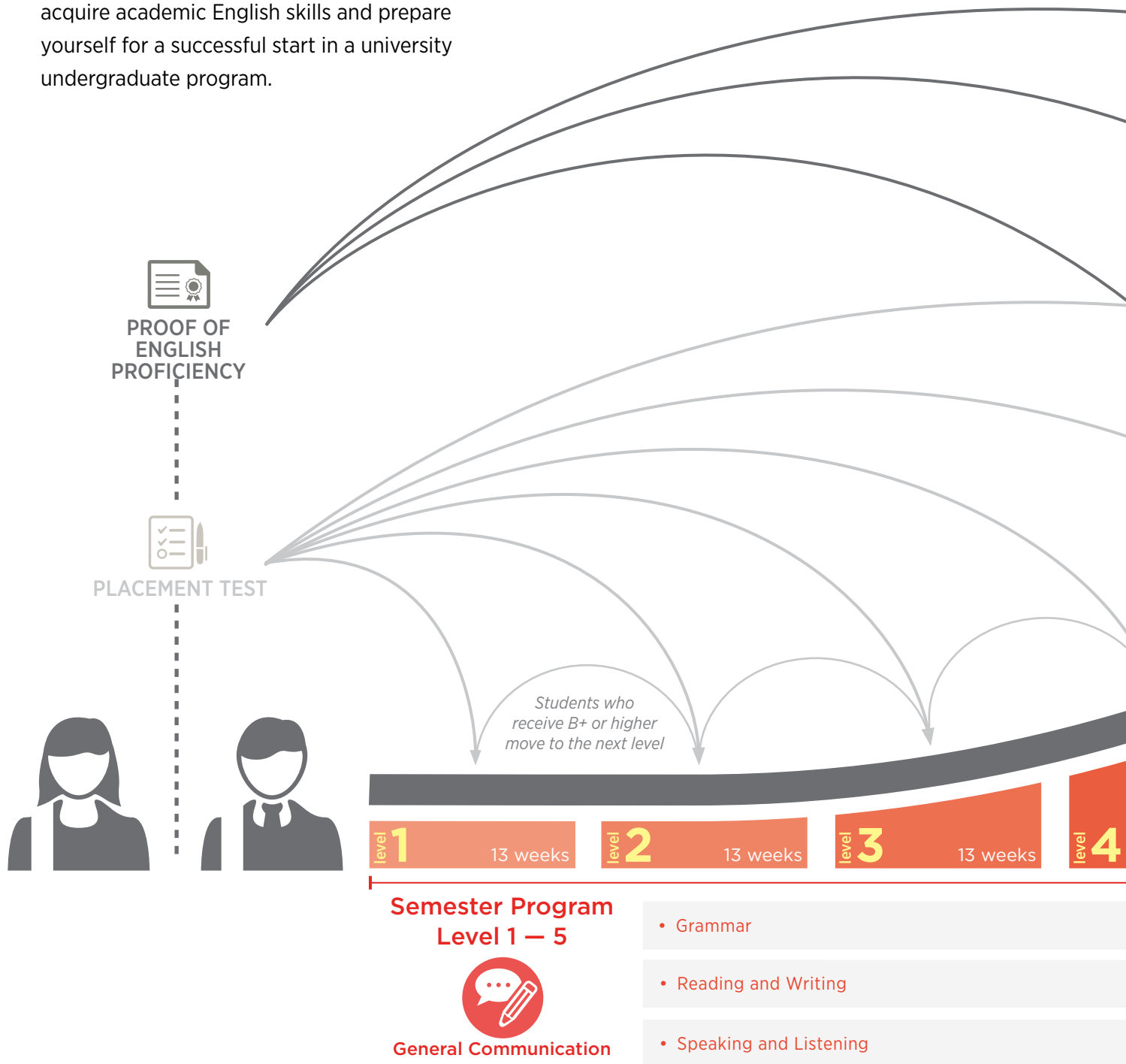

Acquiring Accuracy: Comprehensive English

Academic Focus

Level 6, the top level of our Semester Program, departs from the broad communication goals of levels 1 – 5 and focuses on the written and oral skills necessary for success in the English language post-secondary classroom. Students completing level 6, with a minimum final grade of B+ in each course, are eligible for direct entry to the Academic Communication Certificate.

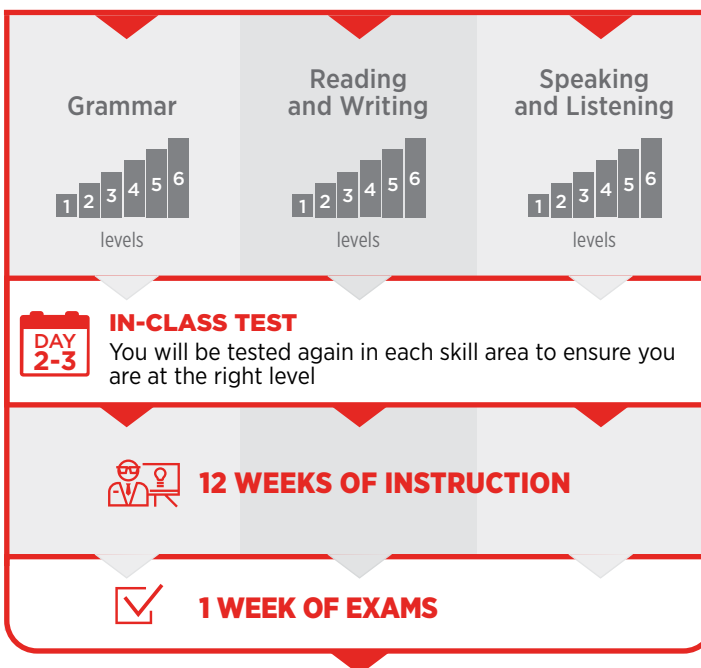

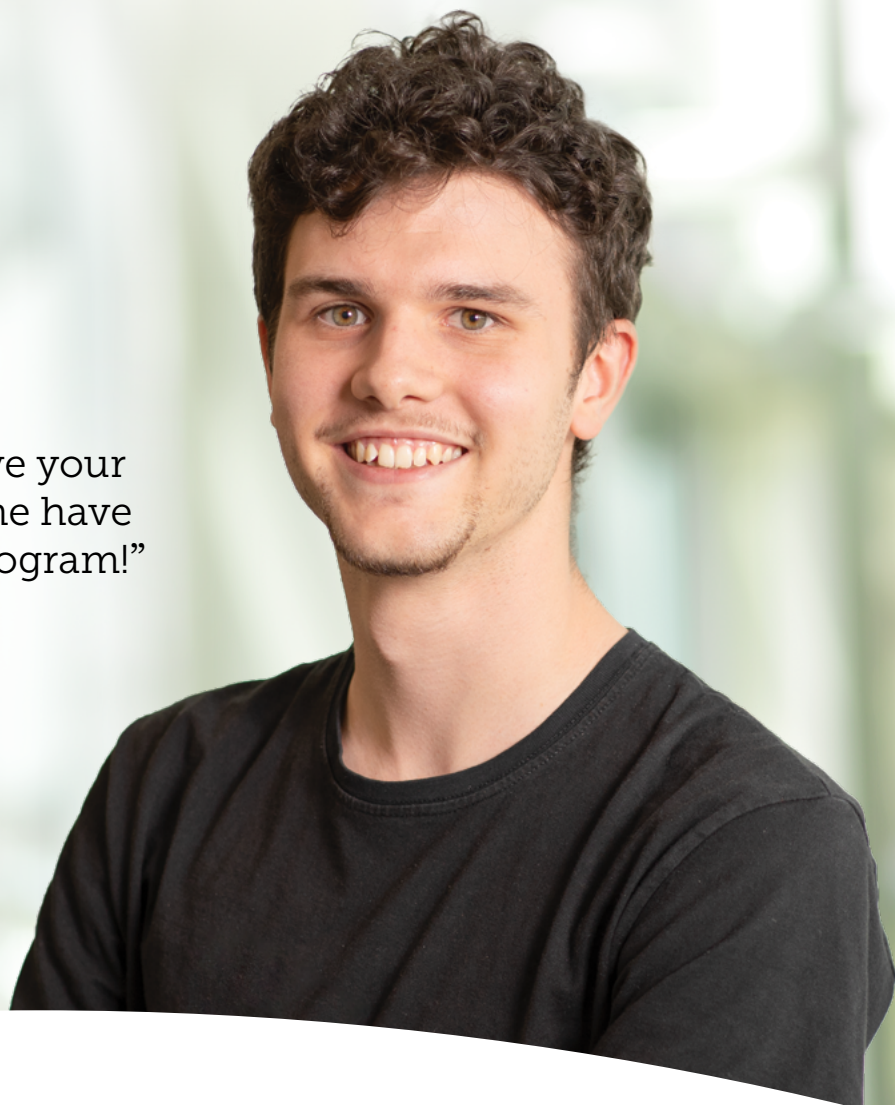

Admission Requirements

Proof of English language proficiency is not required to enter the Semester Program; students will be tested at the beginning of the program and then placed in the appropriate level. Advanced placement in levels 5 and 6 of the Semester Program is available for students wishing to guarantee their level placements. The following minimum requirements must be met for advanced placement.

Level 5

- TOEFL iBT score of 40 overall, 13 in writing
- IELTS Academic score of 5.0 overall, 5 in writing, 4.5 in any other skill area
- CAEL score of 40 overall, 40 in writing
- Duolingo English Test score of 80

Level 6

- TOEFL iBT score of 52 overall, 17 in writing
- IELTS Academic score of 5.5 overall, 5.5 in writing, 5 in any other skill area
- CAEL score of 50 overall, 50 in writing
- Duolingo English Test score of 95

Academic Mastery: University Preparation

The Academic Communication Certificate (ACC) is designed for English learners who want to improve their English skills to enter Canadian university or college programs. Through intensive instruction of English for Academic Purposes (EAP), students will learn essential skills for an academic setting and acquire critical knowledge for a successful transition to Canadian university culture.

ACC students who apply to an applicable UCalgary undergraduate and graduate degree program, and meet the competitive admission requirements are eligible for conditional admission.*

- The condition of admission for undergraduate programs will be met once a student successfully completes all four ACC core courses with a minimum grade of B+ by August 1 in the year of application.
- The condition of admission for graduate programs will be met once a student successfully completes all four ACC core courses with a minimum grade of B+ by August 1, or as designated by the department. Some graduate programs require a minimum grade of A- in some ACC courses. Please contact the graduate program directly to confirm admission requirements.

Students who have completed some ACC courses may be able to take credit courses in Open Studies concurrently with their remaining ACC courses.

**Nursing and Education do not accept the ACC.*

Courses

EAP 220: Academic Writing and Composition (56 hours)

Focus on writing effective academic paragraphs and essays while mastering essential sentence skills and reading critically.

EAP 225: Research Writing and Form (56 hours)

Focus on the process of writing research papers and critical responses while mastering critical reading and thinking. Students will attain advanced skills in comprehension, analysis, interpretation and citation required in research writing.

EAP 230: Critical Listening and Notetaking (56 hours)

This course prepares English learners transitioning to an English-speaking university setting with the skills needed to engage in critical academic listening across content areas.

EAP 235: Oral Communication and Presentation Skills (48 hours)

Develop essential skills that will help English learners defend ideas in academic settings, present coherent concepts, speak thoughtfully in discussions and contribute to group projects.

EAP 249: Academic Success Tutorials (24 hours)

Seminars designed to facilitate success in the Canadian undergraduate degree (credit) environment. Topics include academic integrity, critical thinking, exam conditioning and preparation, health and wellness, learning styles, study strategies, time management, understanding learning objectives and university customs and policies.

VISAS

Most international students require an entrance document — either a visa or an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) — and possibly a study permit to enter and study in Canada. For more information, visit ucalgary.ca/student-services/iss/immigration/study-permits.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- 18 years of age or older*
- High beginner to advanced level of English**
- Willing to participate in all classroom activities

DEADLINES

Applications and non-refundable deposits must be received 30 days before the start of the course. Full payment is due 15 days before the course begins; if full payment is not received, the student will be withdrawn from the course, forfeiting the course deposit.

Two weeks after the course begins, students not present will be withdrawn in accordance with the refund policy. Please inform the office if you cannot start the course on time.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROGRAM CERTIFICATE

A certificate of participation will be given at the end of the course to students who attend a minimum of 90% of classes.

EMERGENCY HEALTH INSURANCE

Emergency health insurance is provided for international students under 65 from the Saturday before the English course start date to the Saturday after the English course end date. All fees must be paid in full for insurance to be processed and valid. Additional insurance is available between courses at an additional cost.

PAYMENT INFORMATION

All course fees are in Canadian dollars. Visa, MasterCard, or American Express are the preferred methods of payment. If paying in person, cash or debit card are also acceptable.

International bank wire transfers are accepted, but require a \$60 processing fee. Bank wire refunds usually take a minimum of 3 months and require a \$60 processing fee.

Deposits:

A deposit is required for each course at the time of registration. All course deposits are towards tuition, not in addition to it. Deposits are non-refundable and non-transferable (exceptions may apply if conditions are met).

There will be a \$50 per course administrative fee for all drops and transfers.

APPLICATION FEE

A \$200 non-refundable application fee is required for admission into the English Language Program. This is a one-time fee.

HOMESTAY FEES

A non-refundable \$250 placement fee is required to apply for homestay. This fee is required each time a placement is requested.

A \$250 storage fee will be charged for periods where students are temporarily absent from homestay and intending to return to the same homestay within 3 weeks. Regular homestay fees will not be charged during this period.

REFUND POLICY

All withdrawals must be made in writing. All refunds will be made via the original payment method. Please note that **program application fees and homestay placement fees are non-refundable under any circumstances.**

Tuition Refunds and Transfers

Tuition refund eligibility is relative to the course/program start date.

Homestay Refunds

14-day written notice is required to cancel homestay. Unused homestay fees and deposits will be refunded on a prorated basis, calculated after the amount of the 14-day notice period has been deducted. Homestay refunds of two nights or less will not be processed. Homestay refunds can be transferred to future homestays.

Refunds and Transfers Related to Visa/Permit Status

If you submitted an application for entry to Canada at least 3 months prior to your program start date and the Government of Canada does not provide you with the required visa/permit to enter Canada, your course tuition fees and deposits will be refunded/ transferred as follows.
